Provider Accreditation Information

CLE credit means Continuing Legal Education, including Live CLE and Self-Study CLE

Live CLE Credit means In-person CLE, Remote Group CLE, or Verified E- CLE.

- **In-person CLE** means CLE presented in a classroom setting where the lawyer or paralegal practitioner is in the same room as the presenter. An hour of In-person CLE means 60 minutes of attendance in a one-hour period at an Accredited CLE program.
- **Remote Group CLE** means CLE sponsored, or cosponsored by the Bar, that is presented from a location in Utah, via a live streaming audio-visual presentation, to another location in Utah where the lawyer or paralegal practitioner is present. An hour of Remote Group CLE means 60 minutes of attendance in a one-hour period at an Accredited CLE program.
- **Verified E-CLE** means CLE presented via a computer program or over the Internet where active participation by the lawyer or paralegal practitioner in the CLE is verified by responding to scenarios during the CLE or answering knowledge-based questions during or after presentation of the CLE. An hour of Verified E-CLE means 60 minutes of the minimum actual viewing time to participate in the Verified E-CLE.
 - Providers must apply specifically for approval of a Verified E-CLE program.
 - Providers must include at least three knowledge-based questions for a one-hour Accredited CLE program.

Verified E-CLE Categories of Accredited CLE:

1. Zoom or Similar Platform – The program takes place in real-time. The lawyer can participate and ask knowledge-based questions about what is being taught during the live program.
2. Webinar – The lawyer is required to answer knowledge-based questions via computer program or over the internet about what is being taught during the program. The CLE provider is required to grade the knowledge-based questions following the program and confirm the lawyer has answered at least 75-80% correctly.
3. Gaming CLE – This type of CLE will be accredited on a case-by-case basis by the Utah Supreme Court Board of Continuing Legal Education. The lawyer is required to actively participate throughout the program by responding to knowledge-based scenarios. The CLE provider is required to review the active participation and confirm the lawyer has completed the program and responded to at least 75-80% of the scenarios correctly.

Self-Study CLE Credit means CLE, other than Live CLE, credited for a number of hours determined by the Board on a case-by-case basis. An hour of Self-Study CLE means an hour of credit assigned by the Board on a case-by-case basis.

- Webcasts or reviewing on-demand programs with no interaction.
- Webcasts or reviewing on-demand programs where the lawyer answers questions, pop-ups or a key word at certain times during the program. The CLE provider does not review or grade the participants answers.
- CLE audio and video.
- Telephonic programs.
